

Instructions for Submission of Interesting Cases for ASCT Website

Each case report should be submitted in WORD format and be no longer than 500 words. Images should be in jpeg format and sent as separate attachments.

The presentation format is as follows:

- **Clinical history** (Include any relevant clinical findings and pertinent history)
- **Specimen information** (specimen type, collection method, preparation method)
- **Cytologic features** (Describe and illustrate the cytologic details of the specimen including specimen cellularity, cellular arrangements, cell size and shape, nuclear features, cytoplasmic features, and specimen background)
- **Cytologic Images** (Images should be referenced in the text. Images should be submitted separately as attached jpeg files and labeled with magnification and type of stain)
- **Cytologic diagnosis**
- **Histologic correlation** (Report how related biopsies or surgical specimens were signed out including results of ancillary studies, if performed. Histologic photomicrographs may be submitted. Images should be referenced in the text. Images should be submitted separately as attached jpeg files and labeled with magnification and type of stain)
- **Discussion** (Discuss and evaluate the details of the entity. Some things to include:
 - What makes this case cytologically interesting?
 - rare tumor/disease
 - unusual presentation of an entity
 - diagnostically challenging case
 - What are the differential diagnoses of this case and the criteria used to distinguish the entities?
 - Were any special stains performed to assist in the correct diagnosis?
 - How do your findings compare with the findings of others, as reported in the literature?
 - What was the follow-up for this patient or if no follow-up was obtained, what is the preferred course of clinical management?)
- **References** (References should be cited in the text of the report. A list of references should be included at the end of the presentation in proper format.)
- Name of submitter including title and institution
